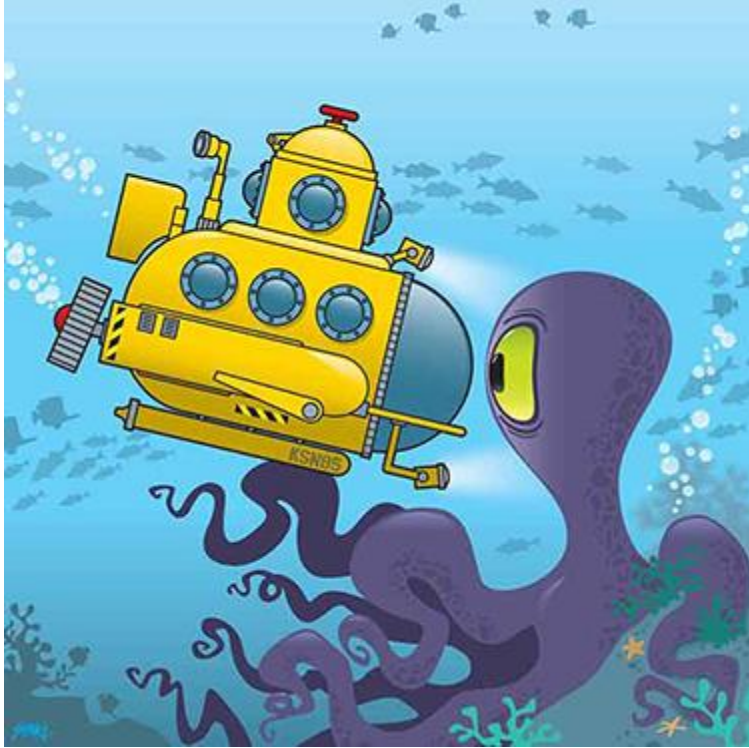

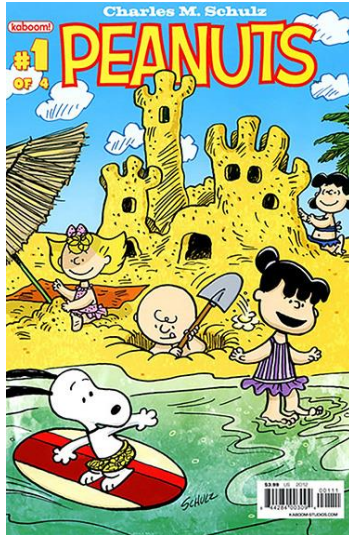
How to Draw

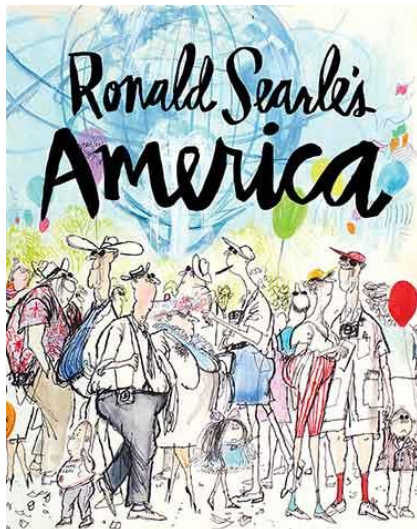


Scott Jeralds, cartoonist for the new Peanuts comic books by KaBOOM!, will demonstrate how to draw some Peanuts characters.

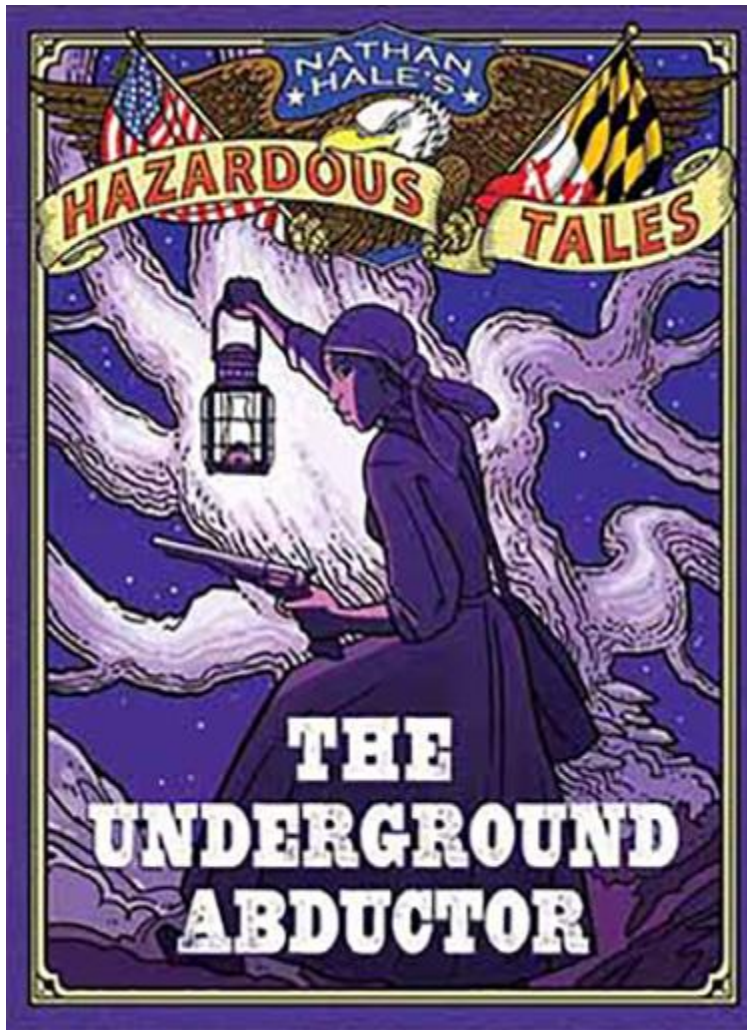
Peanuts and the Picture of Health

What do hyponatremia, amblyopia, and rubeola have to do with *Peanuts*? Schulz's careful study of health issues informed many *Peanuts* plotlines. From physical fitness to mental wellbeing, the cartoon highlighted a range of topics regarding personal health. Schulz himself grew up playing baseball, football, and ice hockey, and later took up jogging, tennis, and even rollerblading—all pursuits that found themselves playfully depicted among the panels of *Peanuts* cartoons.

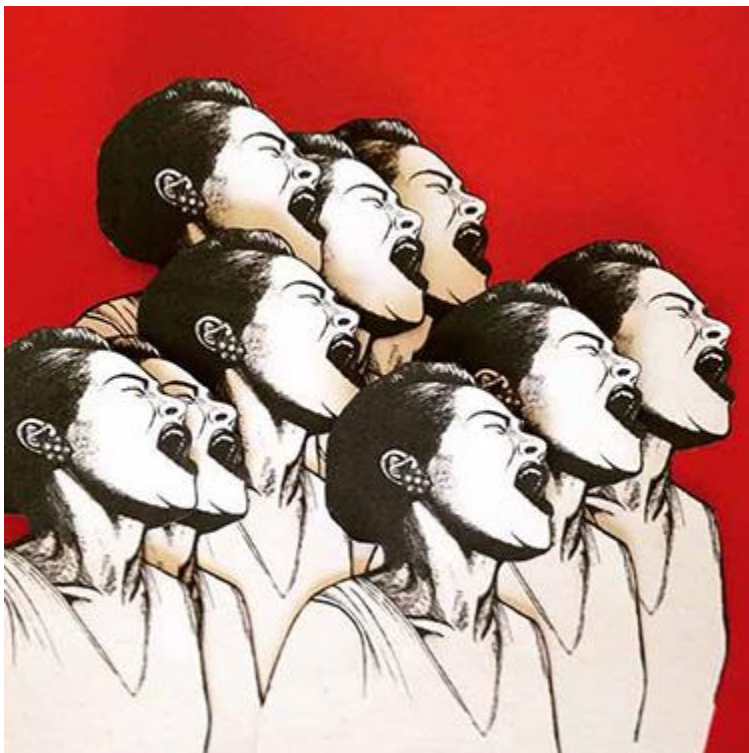
