## **Charles M. Schulz Museum and Research Center FACT SHEET**

### **Mission & About**

The Charles M. Schulz Museum and Research Center opened in 2002 to fulfill its mission of preserving, displaying, and interpreting the art of Charles M. Schulz, the creator of *Peanuts*. The Museum carries out this mission through changing exhibitions and programming that build an understanding of cartoonists and cartoon art; illustrate the scope of Schulz's multi-faceted career; communicate the stories, inspirations, and influences of Schulz; and celebrate the life of Schulz and the *Peanuts* characters.

Located 50 miles north of San Francisco in Santa Rosa, California—where Schulz lived and worked—the Schulz Museum features the largest collection of original *Peanuts* comic strips in the world and presents changing exhibitions and programming for all ages. ### **Why is the Schulz Museum located in Santa Rosa?**

The Museum is located on the property Charles Schulz spent the last thirty years of his life drawing and as he described it, "hanging out." In 1969, the Schulz family built an ice arena, Snoopy's Home Ice, and the Warm Puppy Café for the community to enjoy. Schulz played hockey and hosted ice shows at the ice arena, and enjoyed meals daily at the Warm Puppy Café, as it was within walking distance from his studio. Later, he built Snoopy's Gallery & Gift Shop for all the fans who stopped by and wanted to purchase their beloved *Peanuts* products. The Charles M. Schulz Museum was added in 2002, and although Schulz passed away shortly before its groundbreaking, he was involved in all the important facets of its creation.

### **Museum Highlights**

- Distinctive 27,000-square-foot building inspired by the *Peanuts* comic strip.
- Approximately 100 original *Peanuts* comic strips on view at any one time.
- Biographical and archival materials with a timeline of Schulz's life.
- A re-creation of Schulz's studio including his original chair, drawing board, tools, and bookcases.
- Original nursery wall mural painted by Schulz in 1951 for his daughter Meredith in his Colorado home (wall was removed and relocated to the Schulz Museum).
- *Peanuts* Tile Mural by Japanese artist Yoshiteru Otani. Composed of 3,588 2x8-inch ceramic tiles of *Peanuts* strips to create a scene of Charlie Brown running to kick a football held by Lucy. Approximately 17x22 feet.
- *Morphing Snoopy* bas-relief sculpture composed of 43 layers that have been shaped and cut to reveal the evolving personas of Snoopy, beginning with Spike, Schulz's childhood pet and inspiration for Snoopy. Created by Japanese artist Yoshiteru Otani.
- *Wrapped Snoopy Doghouse* by renowned contemporary artist Christo.
- *Snoopy Labyrinth*, an outdoor labyrinth in the shape of Snoopy's head.
- A 100-seat theater with *Peanuts* animated specials and other programs.
